

Kiwanis Sunrisers Donate Back Packs for Ready Set School



NE Metro Golden K, St Paul Supports Special Projects



One of the Special Projects we supported for the 2025-26 fiscal year is a \$6,100 grant to Northeast Youth and Family Services to develop: 1) a second play therapy room, and 2) a "case management" space for offering essentials to their clients.

The second play therapy room allows twice as many children to be served via this therapeutic modality. It also means two children from the same family can be seen simultaneously rather than parents needing to bring in each child separately.

Partnering with a local food shelf, the case management space will allow Northeast Youth and Family Services to offer select food items, hygiene packs and clothing options for clients in need.

Fargo Roughriders Kiwanis Club Supports Gun Safety Initiatives

Gun violence is a social issue adversely affecting the United States. Children have been especially affected and each day young people face the danger of the number one cause of death in the United States – gun violence. Given that firearm deaths disproportionately affect young people, this is the leading cause of death among U.S. children and adolescents. The number of U.S. children dying by gunfire keeps rising and surpasses drug overdoses, poisonings, drowning and car accidents.

Mortality numbers are only part of the story. For each child lost, there are shattered families and grieving friends; there is psychological trauma and impacts all of us as a society.

Kiwanis Clubs historically take on humanitarian and civic projects that many public authorities are not prepared or able to perform. The Rough Rider Kiwanis Club of Fargo, ND supports sensible firearm safety initiatives and in June 2022 adopted a club resolution.

There are numerous programs available for firearm safety education. Various agencies have safety programs, such as the American College of Surgeons and the NRA. One example is:

Be **SMART** program

Secure all guns in your homes and vehicles;

Model responsible behavior around guns;

Ask about unsecured guns in other homes;

Recognize the role of guns in suicide;

Tell your peers to Be SMART

We encourage all clubs in the Minnesota-Dakotas District to consider including firearm safety initiatives in your programs. Ask your local law enforcement agencies to help you identify issues and then create programs appropriate to address those local issues. Collaborate with those agencies to help to promote these programs at local events.

Kids need to grow up in safe communities where they can thrive. This is one area where we can work with others to help make a difference.
