Hoping everyone had a Happy Thanksgiving!!

Now getting ready for another busy month and enjoy a happy and fun Christmas Holiday! Maybe we will have a White Christmas too.!!

Kiwanis Children's Fund reports updated recently. The Possibility Project total worldwide gifts and pledges is **now over 9 million dollars.** The Children's Fund on-line shows \$9,550,000.00

The Kiwanis clubs in Central USA total gifts are \$2,197,023.47.

And Minnesota-Dakotas District Clubs total gifts is \$191,386.31. Not sure of the number of active clubs in the district now. One monthly report shows 100 clubs. Based on the most recent report, there are twelve clubs in this District who did not participate in contributing to the Children's Funds. Could a few more clubs participate during this 2025-2026 fiscal year?

Another report provided by Kiwanis Children's Fund each month is the total giving by Districts. As of September 30, 2025, the total by MNDAK District clubs for 2024-2025 is \$57,967. This number exceeds Total Giving for 2023-24 fiscal year which was \$54,488. These totals represent funds from Clubs, Individuals and others.

Based on total giving each year, our District Education Foundation receives a 5% rebate which is then used to provide more scholarships to students. This year that amount should be around \$2898.00.

Together, this is how each club makes an **Impact** by improving the world one child and one community at a time. #Kids need Kiwanis.
