Monthly Wrap Up

November 1st Meeting

Our speaker for today....

One of our very own members, Dr. Thomas Lubben joined us today and shared with us his successes in his writer's experiences. Tom is admittedly a lifetime educator, learner, and dreamer. He resides in the Lehigh Valley, Pennsylvania with his wife Carole. Tom has 26 extended family members scattered over six states. He has traveled extensively. Tom uses these experiences in the creation of his books. Tom actually published 4 new books in 2023 via two separate publishers. (Not bad for an 82-year-old! these are his words)

Current Projects

Tom's debut novel, Death Among the Pines, was published in February of 2022 through Austin Macauley Publishers. He continues to actively market his works both in Pennsylvania and Southern New Jersey. He has completed four additional novels expanding the career of his protagonist, BJ Gleeson. In the second novel, independently published April 2023, "Death on the Bayou" BJ visits New Orleans. The third adventure has the (now) private investigator in San Antonio, Texas at the site of the "Death on the Day of the Dead" along the famed River Walk. Tom has completed Book IV in the series: "Death on the Grand Strand" which has BJ traveling to Myrtle Beach to solve a series of murders on a famous golf course. His 5th book in the series is also ready for publication, "Death Over the Cliffs" is set in County Mayo, Ireland. His latest (6th book) is set in Cape May, New Jersey and is entitled "Death on Diamond Beach".

Tom has two spiritual non-fiction books due for publication. The first book is titled "A Year's Journey". It takes you on a spiritual journey for 365 days with a verse, comments on the verse, an image, and a question for the Reader on each page. Published May 2023 by Lighthouse Christian Publishing.

His second spiritual work, "The Eye-Witnesses" (Common People Who Observed Jesus' Miracles) focuses on ordinary people during the life of Jesus. It focuses on ten major events in the life of Jesus. Published by Lighthouse Christian release date by the end of 2023. You can buy Tom's books on Amazon and Barnes and Noble bookstores.

Today's speaker is Rebecca Escott....

Rebecca is returning today to bring us up to date on one of the newest courses offered by PennState Extension Better Kid Care online training platform. Rebecca came to us a while back to introduce this course and encourage our Club to donate funds to help support the development of the course. Here is what we learned today.

Nature Sketching Builds Strong Observation Skills....this is where Rebecca passed out some objects for observation and a tool for sketching. She explained the following information to us by creating an exercise to illustrate how to improve our powers of observation by honing our ability to focus, recall, reflect and refine. She continued by explaining how the goal is NOT to train an artist but to enhance an educator's ability to observe and document their world. Included tools and strategies support opportunities for adults and a parallel practice with toddlers through teens. Nature sketching meets a wide range of learning standards. As nature observation skills are refined, child observation skills are positively transformed. A keener, more specific way to observe the children to better meet their needs individually.

The following are the specific objectives of the course:

Objectives

- Practice deep noticing and eye-hand coordination skills using a natural item reference and several sketching exercises
- Make and use one or more sketching tools to support documentation and increased focus during observations
- Explore strategies for introducing and refining nature sketching experiences for the children in your care

We as a Club should be very gratified in helping to fund this project....along with some other donors....the chance to contribute to the ongoing education of folks who work with and teach children. They, too, are heroes!

November 29th Meeting

Today's meeting was held at SURV Restaurant with Scott Fisher presiding. He opened the meeting by welcoming everyone. We said the *Pledge of Allegiance* and sang *God Bless America*. Barb Walters shared words of wisdom and Scott them introduced our speaker, Ann Flood, PA State Representative.

Representative Flood referring to Barb's words about kindness said that the State Legislature recently passed a resolution for Kindness Week, saying that since Covid there is a greater need for kindness. Brought to the PA House of Representatives by her desire to help others, Flood represents the 13th Legislative District in Northampton County.

Her topic for today was how to better serve the community of children by investing in their education, health and well being. She said children are our future, hope and our responsibility. They are the conduit of our heritage.

Ann built a foundation 2008, prior to the Legislature, to enhance the quality of life for brain injured children and to support their families. Lauren's Hope Foundation was started in memory

of her daughter, Lauen, who passed away at the age of 4 in 2007 as a result of a brain injury sustained at birth.

Topics discussed at this meeting were the challenges the legislature faces with regard to childcare; a resolution to declare May as Foster Care Month; recognizing students experiencing homelessness and the barriers it presents to education; plans to improve the WIC System and addressing mental health needs in rural communities.. Ann also hosted a workshop about providing financial aid to college bound students in the bottom 15% of performance.

Aside from the topics discussed Rep. Flood also serves on several committees including Labor and Industry and Aging and Older Adults. A question and answer session followed.


