I sincerely hope that this letter finds you in good health. I would like to offer my deepest condolences on the loss of your husband, Lynn. While I only met him once or twice he has left a lasting impact on me, one of kindness and inspiration. Back in April I had the opportunity to conversate with Lynn at the Scholarship Dinner at Tony's Pizza. Though we had just been introduced, Lynn was very open to listening to my interests and lending me advice on how to proceed in my path of engineering. He used his experience from his long and successful career to give me advice that will hopefully lead me to my own success. It was clear to me that I was sitting with a man whose greatest ambition was to serve those around him. In addition, at that same dinner

at Tony's your husband reminded me of a very important fact of life, "nothing is over until you give it up". Many people in their eighties find joy in slowing down, but Lynn was very proud to inform all of us of his 10- mile bike ride that same day. This truly showed me that in life you can do anything until you decide that you can't and it seemed there was very little that your husband, decided he couldn't do. When I was informed of his passing I knew that this world has lost one of its great citizens, somebody who gave his time to the service of others consistently. Though in this World, Lynn will be missed, it is my firm belief that he has been called home by his Creator, for his work here on Earth is done. Many people have benefited from Lynn's community efforts and many more, like myself, have been rewarded just by his kindness. In the gospels we hear that after the ascension of Christ, the disciples mourn the loss of the teacher and their Lord. It is during this mourning that they are reminded that he is not gone, but that he has simply taken his seat in heaven so that he can serve the whole world. I know that unless something can keep him from it, Lynn is up there doing all that he can to guide the generations to come to find success. I hope that one day when my time comes that I may shake his hand and offer my gratitude to him directly, but until then, Lynn, yourself and your family are constantly in my thoughts and prayers.

The Kiwanis Club of Easton would like to congratulate Marybeth Okula, Principal of St. Jane Frances de Chantal School, on her retirement. She has been instrumental in setting up and advising the K-Kids Club at St. Jane's with teacher Christi Johnstone. A few days before her retirement, three members of the Kiwanis Club of Easton (Walt Howell (K-Kids Kiwanis advisor), Rosemary Kocher and Sue Gallagher) spoke with Marybeth Okula about her time at St. Jane's and her future plans.



Marybeth's path to her career in education was not direct. She attended secretarial school in Manhattan, got a Business Degree in Marketing and an MBA and worked on Wall Street for 8 years before moving to Easton in 1999.

She began volunteering at St. Jane's when her son entered school there. This led to substitute teaching after she got an emergency certificate, teaching for 11 years at St. Theresa's School in Hellertown ("a great experience"), while pursuing her teaching certificate and then to St. Jane's School as a principal. She said St. Jane's was a great fit. It was home, she loves children and she had a marketing degree.

- <u>Advice</u> be true to yourself. You have to have a sense of humor. Don't make rash decisions (she has a 24-hour rule think it over first). Be sure to understand all sides and do what is best for the children.
- <u>Future</u> She loves doing things for the community and she said that K-Kids really fosters helping the community in the children. She plans to stay involved at St. Jane's as a volunteer.
- Retirement to be whole, happy and healthy. To spend time with her family her husband of 34 years, Mark; her son Christopher, his wife, Kate, and their 2 sons; daughter, Jenna-Rose; and her parents.
- <u>Legacy</u> that she is caring, fun and loving; She cared for all involved at St. Jane's School,

students, teachers and parents and she gave 110%.


