Officer Awards

The office of President is the highest office available to members at the club level. A President must accept responsibilities and possess excellent leadership abilities to maintain a healthy and active club. This is vital for Circle K International to continue providing meaningful leadership to its members while fulfilling its objective of serving the campus and community. The award recognizes the Club President who is the best all-around club leader in our district. This award is named for Lanton Lee, who served the Ohio District of Circle K as Governor from 1986-1987 and as a Distinguished District Administrator from 1994-1998, from The Ohio State University.
